Statement	<p>Student transportation service may be cancelled from time to time due to inclement weather and/or poor road conditions. In the interest of student safety, when the outside temperature reaches a predetermined extreme cold temperature, student transportation will be cancelled for the day.</p>
Practice	<p>When the outside AMBIENT temperature reaches -34 degrees Celsius at 6:00 am, student transportation may be cancelled for the morning or for the day.</p> <p>Determination and process of the cancellation will be as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ STSTB will monitor the weather conditions and temperatures throughout the night. ➤ If the ambient temperature is -34°C or below, regardless of wind chill, on the Environment Canada Weather Website (at the Thunder Bay Airport) (http://weather.gc.ca) at 6:00 am, student transportation may be cancelled for the morning. ➤ All factors are to be considered before any cancellation of student transportation and the duration thereof. (eg. weather forecast including the expected duration and severity of the extreme cold temperatures). ➤ STSTB will contact the member school boards and inform them of any decision to cancel transportation. ➤ Any decision to close schools for the day is the responsibility of the individual member school boards.
